#### **ELIGIBILITY**

To be eligible for consideration, an applicant must:

- \* be a son, daughter, grandson, or granddaughter of a current employee of an NRC member company; and
- \* be enrolled at the time of application as a full-time college student at an accredited two-year college offering an associate's degree or an accredited four-year college or university offering a bachelor's degree, or as a recently graduated high school senior that is enrolled to start college this fall.

#### AMOUNT OF AWARDS

Three scholarships will be awarded as follows: the first place applicant will receive \$8,000, the second place applicant will receive \$4,000, and the third place applicant will receive \$2,000. 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# FRA/NRC Webinar on Part 243 Training Standards Final Rule Confirmation

On Thursday, July 30, 2015, at 2pm EDT the NRC will be hosting a webinar briefing with FRA personnel for NRC members on the requirements of the FRA's Part 243 Minimum Training Standards for Safety-Related Railroad Employees regulation.

As a reminder, on November 7, 2014, the FRA published a <u>final rule</u> for training requirements for all railroad employees <u>and</u> <u>contractors</u> who perform safety-related work. The Final Rule requires railroad employees and contractors who perform safety-related work to be trained and qualified to comply with any relevant federal railroad safety laws, regulations, and orders. The rule represents the first time that railroad contractors will be directly regulated by the FRA.

The requirements include minimum training standards for each type of safety-related railroad employee, with the FRA reviewing and approving each employer's training program to determine that each employee will be qualified to measurable standards. The rule also calls for greater use of structured on-the-job and interactive training.

**Issue Date:** July 16, 2015

Location: Fairwater, WI and Markesan, WI

**Description:** The contractor shall supply all supervision, labor, equipment, and material (except that material specifically designated to be supplied by the Wisconsin & Southern Railroad) to perform tie replacement, road crossing replacement, turnout replacement and continuously welded rail (CWR) installation on the Markesan Subdivision of the Wisconsin & Southern Railroad (henceforth RAILROAD) between Mile Post 165.34 in Fairwater to Mile Post 172.67 in Markesan, Wisconsin in accordance to the Project Documents. Work includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Replace 4,000 CONTRACTOR-supplied crossties that have been previously marked by the RAILROAD for replacement;

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### **Rocla Acquires KSA Concrete Tie Business**

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### **BNSF Set to Begin Rail-Spur Construction in Kansas**

BNSF Railway Co. and NorthPoint Development will soon begin construction of an industrial rail spur and North Park near the Logistics Park Kansas City Intermodal Facility (LPKC) in Edgerton, Kan.

The rail spur will open 325 acres of rail-served property on Waverly Road north of 183rd Street known as North Park, BNSF officials announced late last week.

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### CTA Purple Line Express to get \$30 million Improvement Project

The Chicago Transit Authority's (CTA) Purple Line Express is set to

receive \$30 million for improvement to tracks between Lawrence and Jarvis stations, the latest, CTA says, in its ongoing investment in the Purple Line to improve service for customers.

The Purple Line Express Track Improvement Project will upgrade track infrastructure and will be the largest track renewal project for this section of track in 40 years. The work is just the latest of several improvements CTA has made to Purple Line service, which includes the ongoing Ravenswood Connector project that is rehabilitating tracks shared by Brown and Purple Line Express trains between Armitage and the Merchandise Mart. It also follows a major track improvement project completed in 2013 that rehabilitated tracks and eliminated slow zones between Howard and Linden.

The estimated four-month project is scheduled to begin July 20 with construction expected to be completed by the end of November 2015. The project includes the replacement of crossties, restoration of track alignment and partial replacement of running rail along aging Purple Line Express tracks that serve more than 3.5 million passenger trips each year.

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## DOT Credit Council Recommends \$26.8 Million in RRIF Funding for Two Short-Line Rail Freight Terminal Projects

The Department of Transportation's Credit Council recommended approval of two federal loans for freight rail projects from the Railroad Rehabilitation and Improvement (RRIF) Program. The formal Credit Council recommendation is one of the major final steps in the process of approving a RRIF loan.

The first loan application is from the Stockton Port District in California. This inland deepwater port is located on the San Joaquin River, which provides a shipping channel leading directly to San Francisco Bay. This growing port serves both western Class I railroads and saw 230 vessel calls in 2014 with a throughput of over \$1.5 billion worth of freight traffic. The port switching railroad, short-

line carrier Central California Traction, handled more than 48,000 cars last year. The \$8.2 million loan will be used to make critically needed capacity improvements by reconfiguring and rehabilitating legacy rail lines and constructing brand new rail infrastructure. The second loan application is for \$18.6 million to Peterson Industrial Properties, LLC and Rocky Mountain Rail Car & Repair, LLC. Rocky Mountain is an established operator of an AAR M-1003 certified railcar repair shop located at the former Tooele Army Depot, now the Peterson Industrial Depot, located just outside of Salt Lake City. Directly served by the Union Pacific Railroad, Rocky Mountain provides a wide range of railcar services including general inspections, maintenance and repair; tank car cleaning and disposal; food-grade conversions; hopper cleaning; wreck repair; rebuilds; and 286K upgrades. They have a large scale metal fabrication facility onsite enabling manufacturing of various major railcar components. They also provide short-line freight rail switching services to their various tenant shippers in the Depot property, which covers 350 acres and includes 1.9 million square feet of commercial and warehouse space. Another line of business offered by this growing enterprise is rolling stock storage, with track space in the Depot sufficient to accommodate over 300 railcars.

The RRIF loan funds will be used to increase facility capacity by constructing new rail spurs, yard tracks and associated improvements, and to refinance debt incurred for the original acquisition of the depot and development of parts of the facility. These investments will support further business expansion that is expected following receipt of M1002 (tank car) and S2034 (car building) certifications that have been applied for through AAR.
